LULAC-WISCONSIN CALLS FOR SWIFT PASSAGE OF COMPREHENSIVE IMMIGRATION REFORM

LULAC-Wisconsin calls upon the next U.S. Congress to make the swift passage of comprehensive immigration reform it's first priority. "We believe the people of Wisconsin and in fact the country have spoken and they expect swift passage of comprehensive immigration reform out of this new Congress," stated Yolanda Santos-Adams, State Director. "People have grown weary of extremist positions and lack of progress on this very important issue. This is why they voted for change," Santos-Adams added.

"We expect the new Congress to pass and for the President to sign legislation that secures our borders, meets our country's economic and labor needs, while fulfilling our great country's commitment to human rights," stated Darryl D. Morin, Deputy State Director. "For far to long, the Federal Government has taken a piece meal approach to immigration and now current policy is neither coherent or consistent frustrating the most dedicated of immigration officials, judges and border patrol personnel," Morin added.
