Do you want to save on your prescriptions? It is now possible! Use your RxSavingsPlus saving card to save money on your prescriptions that are not covered by your insurance or if you are uninsured. RxSavingsPlus offers access to 57,000 participating pharmacies nationwide.

1. Register online for your savings card and print it out to start saving on medical prescriptions at <http://lulac.rxsavingsplus.com>.
2. Take your discount card to any participating pharmacy. Eight out of ten pharmacies nationwide are participating in the program; including CVS, Rite Aid and Walgreens. Find one near you at <http://lulac.rxsavingsplus.com>
3. Show your RxSavingsPlus card to the pharmacists along with your prescription(s).
4. Pay the pharmacy your discounted rate at time of purchase.

You should also investigate other options and resources that you may qualify for which could save you even more than the RxSavingsPlus Program. Be sure to look into the following prescription assistance programs which can be used in addition to or in place of RxSavingPlus.

1) Partnership for Prescription Assistance (PPA)

PPA's health care provider and clinic database connects patients with free clinics and health care providers in their communities. You may access more than 475 public and private patient assistance programs that could offer help on more than 2,500 prescriptions medicines (including a wide range of generics) by calling toll free 1-888-4PPA-NOW. 2) Wal-Mart/SAM'S CLUB \$4 Generic Prescription Program

Various generic prescriptions are available under the Wal-Mart \$4 generic prescription drug program. The price is available in select stores only for up to a 30 day supply at commonly prescribed dosages. The RxSavingsPlus card can be used at Wal-Mart but will only result in savings on prescriptions not included in their \$4 program. 3) Kmart Pharmacy Discount Card offers 90 day supply of generics drugs for \$15.00

Kmart offers a three months supply of generic prescriptions for \$15.00. Locate a Kmart pharmacy near you. Call 1-800-866-0086 or visit www.kmart.com.

4) Medicare or Medicaid Option

Both Medicare and Medicaid offer prescription drug coverage. If you have limited income and resources, you may get extra help to pay for your Medicare drug plan costs. If you are a Medicare beneficiary, you are eligible for Medicare prescription drug coverage, regardless of your income, health status, or current prescription expenses. Medicaid is available only to certain low-income individuals and families who fit into eligibility group that is recognized by federal and state law. 5) Wisconsin Badger Care Program

The Wisconsin Badger Care Program is a Wisconsin program with the goal of providing health insurance to low income families. To be eligible you must have a child under 19 years of age living with you, have a combined that falls within the guidelines, and you must not be covered by any other health insurance plan.
